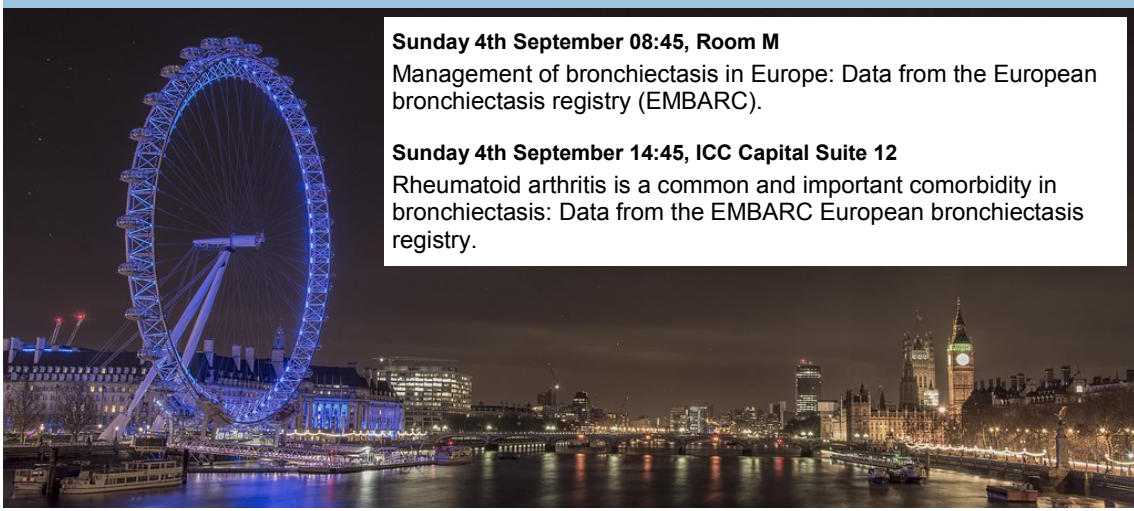

Rheumatoid arthritis is a common and important comorbidity in bronchiectasis: Data from the EMBARC European bronchiectasis registry.



IMPORTANT -Review Data-

In order to meet the main objectives of the Registry it is extremely important we gather longitudinal data for all the recruited patients. We have designed the Review CRF to be as quick and easy to fill out as possible. If a patient is no longer in secondary care or has died this can be updated at any time—you do not need to wait for the expected Review period before completing this.

For those continuing in secondary care, only **new information** should be entered into the Review CRF which makes completion much faster.

Please do not enter data which has been captured at the baseline visit, and please remember the Essential Data Sets include;

- Spirometry
- QOL-B
- Microbiology
- Radiology
- Exacerbation History
